Cookies Policy

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1. Introduction

Noemon Finance Limited is a private limited company incorporated in the Republic of Cyprus (Registration Number HE 427234), authorised and regulated by the Cyprus Securities and Exchange Commission (“CySEC”) as a Cyprus Investment Firm (“CIF”) under licence number 449/24 (hereinafter the “Company”, “we”, “us”, or “our”).

The provisions of this Cookies Policy (the “Policy”) apply to existing and potential clients, as well as to visitors of the Company’s website as applicable, and relate solely to the use of cookies.

This Policy has been established to ensure compliance with Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council (“GDPR”) and Directive 2002/58/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council (the “EU ePrivacy Directive”), as transposed into Cyprus Law through The Regulation of the Electronic Communications and Postal Services Law of 2004 (Law 112(I)/2004) as in force from time to time.

This Policy explains what cookies are, the different types of cookies, the information collected by cookies, how that information is used and how to manage cookie settings. This Policy shall be read in conjunction with our **Privacy Policy**. The Company reserves the right to update this Policy at any time without any prior notice.

2. What are Cookies?

Cookies are text files with small pieces of information that are downloaded and stored on your device when you visit a website. Cookies are necessary for a website to operate and give web servers the ability to keep data on the user’s device or monitor the user’s browsing habits. Additionally, they can be used to store data that users have previously entered into form fields for later use.

You can choose if and how a cookie will be accepted by customising your consent preferences through the Cookie Settings on your browser. You can also choose to disable or delete some or all cookies from your device. However, this might affect your user experience while using our website as certain functions might not work properly.

Cookies are used to enhance your user experience when you use our website. Some cookies are used to help us make our website function properly and more secure.

3. Types of Cookies

There are different types of cookies. Some of them are necessary for a website to function properly, while others ensure that additional features of a website are accessible.

Based on their source, cookies are categorised into the following categories:

- **First-Party Cookies:** These are set directly by us through our website and are typically used to enhance our website functionality and improve user experience.
- **Third-Party Cookies:** These are created and stored on our website by external providers. While we do not directly control these cookies, we require all our partners to comply with applicable data protection laws.

Based on their purpose, cookies can be classified as follows:

- i. **Strictly Necessary/Essential Cookies:** These cookies are essential for our website to function properly. They allow users to go back and forth between websites without losing their previous actions. As they are necessary for the operation of our website, strictly necessary cookies can be used without the need for obtaining the prior consent of the user. Non-essential cookies will only be stored on your device after we have obtained your explicit consent. You can withdraw your consent at any time.

- ii. **Performance/Analytics Cookies:** They are used to collect statistics about the users' behaviour anonymously and improve the performance of a website. Performance cookies can:
 - Count page visits;
 - Examine how much time a user has spent on our website;
 - Analyse loading speeds;
 - Analyse the website behaviour in different browsers;
 - Check whether error messages are displayed.

- iii. **Functional or Functionality Cookies:** They are used to provide features beyond essential functionality. They are not vital for a website to operate, but allow websites to remember user preferences and settings to enhance the browsing experience. These cookies allow websites to maintain personalised interactions, storing data such as name, login details, language settings, font size and style settings and other user preferences. Without them, certain functions may not be available.

- iv. **Advertising/Marketing Cookies:** These cookies are also called tracking cookies. They are used to track user behaviour across multiple websites to deliver personalised advertisements.

Based on their duration, cookies can be classified into **Session Cookies** and **Persistent Cookies**.

Both Persistent and Session Cookies store a user's information, settings, preferences, or sign-on credentials, when the user consents to such information being stored. However, Session and Persistent Cookies have distinct roles and different lifespans as follows:

Persistent Cookies: They memorise your settings to ensure the same user experience whenever you revisit a site in the future. Persistent cookies are commonly used for user

authentication. If disabled, a website would never keep you logged in to your account between sessions and would always require you to re-enter your credentials. Unlike Session Cookies, Persistent Cookies retain a user's information even after they close their browser. These cookies remain on your hard drive until they expire or are manually deleted.

Session Cookies: These cookies are temporary data stored in a user's web browser only during a browsing session. Session Cookies are designed to enhance the browsing experience within a specific session and they do not follow you after you close the web browser. They are automatically deleted as soon as you close your browser window or leave the website.

4. Data Collected through Cookies

Cookies may collect information such as:

- Your IP address;
- Your device and browser details;
- Pages visited;
- Time spent on a website;
- Click behaviour;
- Referral sources.

Personal data collected via cookies is processed according to our Privacy Policy

5. How can you manage Cookies?

You can enable, disable, manage, or block cookies.

Generally, you can delete all cookies that are already on your device by clearing the browsing history of your browser. This will remove all cookies from all websites you have

visited. In such a case, you might lose some saved information, such as your login details and website preferences.

In addition, you can set most modern browsers to prevent any cookies being placed on your device, but you may then have to manually adjust some preferences every time you visit a website. However, some services and functionalities may not work properly.
